THE CHALLENGE

Construction employers operate under a growing set of labor laws that directly shape how projects are staffed, how workers are classified, and how risk is managed on the jobsite. Back Pay and Penalty Exposure

Project Disruptions

Incomplete time, pay, or onboarding records make it harder to defend practices when challenged.

Loss of Contract Eligibility

Repeated violations can affect standing with public agencies and project owners.
